

Join the John F. Malley Society

One interesting way is by leaving a legacy. By naming the ENF in your will, planning a gift of life insurance or transferring appreciated stock, you will be eligible for membership in the John F. Malley Society. Members of the Malley Society are dedicated to ensuring the ENF continues its charitable works well into the future. Malley Society members receive a pin, medallion, their named listed in Heartbeat, the ENF donor newsletter, and an invitation to a special event held each year at the Elks National Convention. Donate your Retired Minimum Distribution Tax Free!

If you are over 73 and have pretax investments, Like a 40lk or traditional IRA, you are required to withdraw a minimum amount each year. That withdrawal is taxable, and in many cases sends you into a higher tax bracket. I have heard several retirees say, "We don't need it, and it just messes things up. The solution - Donate all or part directly from your investment fund to the Elks National Foundation, tax free! This is called a QCD - Qualified Charitable Distribution. This can actually lower your tax liability instead of raising it! You must initiate the transfer during the tax year. Check with your tax consultant or investment firm on when to initiate a QCD.

Madison Middle School Motivated Mustangs

The Motivated Mustangs are our Beacon Grant project and will run the entire school year. It is an

official school function at Madison Middle school, and our club meets monthly, under the supervision of the school's guidance counselor. We usually meet in the school cafeteria, but this month we were routed to an outdoor picnic area between classroom wings. The 8th Graders were having an ROTC rally in the cafeteria. Luckily, it was a beautiful Florida Fall Day – sunny and cool. We always feed the kids first – and this month they had a choice of a chicken sandwich or nuggets lunch box from Chick-fil-A.



Five of the students in the club were 8th graders, so they chose their food, and we set it aside while they ran to the cafeteria for the rally. Our main activity was addressing Thanksgiving cards to their parents or guardians. For some reason, addressing an envelope is not taught in elementary school anymore, and this was more difficult and time consuming than we expected! The 8th graders returned before the others finished this task. Many students did not know their zip code, and one student, whose single parent recently passed, had no idea where she would be spending Thanksgiving break. It was eye opening for us volunteers to see how badly these students really did need some extra support. As the students completed that task, they moved on to one of the Win It in a Minute games – blowing up a balloon, but instead of tying it off releasing the air from it to knock over red solo cups. If successful, they were rewarded with candy, of course. After the bell rang, and the students left, project manager Patty Volpe inserted a \$50.00 Walmart gift card into each of the envelopes. The social worker will check the addresses and mail them in time for the adult in the family to get them early on the week of Thanksgiving. We were grateful the ENF CIP staff agreed to allow us to help the family with food since there was no guarantee of food stamps and the students will not be receiving free breakfast and lunch at school. (When you are using a Grant, any changes must be approved by ENF in advance.)







Past Events and Projects

THE FREEDOM GRANT PROVIDES A FUN DAY FOR OUR VETERANS ON THE FUN BOAT

On November 1st, Tampa Elks used their Freedom Grant to treat homeless Veterans from Salvation Army and Liberty Manor for Veterans to a narrated sightseeing trip through the Downtown Tampa Waterways, followed by lunch at a waterside café. 9 Elks also participated, allowing for much socializing with the Veterans.

The day started at 10 AM when we boarded the Tampa Fun Boat from the dock at Rick's on the Rivers, a waterside café on the Hillsborough River just north of downtown. That location worked well, as the Café was not yet open and parking at the dock and at the café was ample- and free! We were lucky to have perfect Florida fall weather – Sunny and cool!



As the boat pulled in, we noticed that Liberty Manor for Veterans had not shown up, and a quick call established they were still 15-20 minutes out. The captain of the boat, husband of a 12 year Tampa Elk, said that he could not wait due to a large charter booked right after us. He was, however, agreeable to rerouting the Liberty Manor van to a dock downtown, and we did pick them up there. We certainly appreciated his ability to adjust!

The tour went around Harbor Island, Through the Garrison Channel past the Port of Tampa (which we learned was now the largest port in Florida) and down as far as the Peter O'Knight airport on Davis Islands, which is a small airport serving privately owned planes and medivac helicopters,

On our return we passed close to the University of Tampa, home to the iconic spires and the Henry B Plant Museum, and we learned of its unique role in making Tampa a prized destination for rail travelers.

We created a fixed price menu to distribute to everybody while we were still on the boat, and when we sat down, we had already chosen our entrée and beverage and only had to add the table number. Lunch went smoothly at the outside riverfront café, which accommodated us by offering us a dessert from their dinner menu. Every participant agreed it was a pleasant and relaxing morning, and both groups were profuse in their gratitude.

Spotlight Grant Project Harvest of Happiness Drive Through Event

When the government reopened, Tampa Lodge 708 learned of a great opportunity to use our Spotlight Grant. Suzanne Malloy, President of Blue Star Families at MacDill AFB, was trying to give 350 military families the ingredients needed for a traditional Thanksgiving meal. Her plan, which turned out to be a great success, was to do a drive by event on a weekday, so the service members or their spouse could just pull up in their car, receive a LOT of food, and move on, No need to park, walk, drag the kids through a store, or anything like that. For the military, it would be as easy as the pumpkin pie they were going to receive.

The problem for us was timing- it was already November, and her planned and approved date for distribution was the 19th. When called, the Community Investment division of ENF was quick to say that they liked the project. With no opportunity to present it at a Lodge meeting the Executive Board was polled. The vote came back affirmative, and Mrs. Malloy was notified we were in for both funds and volunteers. This was on Thursday the 7th, she said she would need the names, phones DL # 's and emails for the volunteers by Monday the 10th, which was a very small window to get the word out. Somehow, by Monday, 10 volunteers had committed, and the names were submitted for approval for base access. On the 16th, just 2 days before the event, the Lodge was able to present Ms. Malloy with the check. She spoke to the members present, explained that while it may not appear that active-duty military would need assistance, those in the lower ranks that arrived with a family were struggling in our high-cost area. The sign-up sheet was rank restricted, at least for the first couple of hours. After all the lower ranked was served, the base notified those veterans that had gone unpaid that they could participate.

The first couple of hours we sorted and packed boxes, then at noon the cars arrived, first a trickle, then a swarm. Each car was loaded with dry goods, produce, refrigerated items, a turkey and a pumpkin pie. The last half hour was clean up. Thank you to those Tampa Elks who voted for the project, and to those who volunteered. 382 families received Thanksgiving meal items. Over the course of the two-days it took to execute, over 130 volunteers were utilized. The Blue Star Families Blue for Active Duty-will be a great contact.



This year's Elks Casino Night Fundraiser was a resounding success, raising vital funds to support local underprivileged children this Christmas. Hosted by the Youth Committee, the event brought together members & friends for a night of professional casino games, raffles, and holiday cheer, all in support of a great cause.

A Night of Fun and Generosity

The event featured popular casino games like blackjack, poker, roulette, and craps, with expert dealers ensuring an exciting and festive atmosphere. Guests also enjoyed raffle baskets filled with amazing prizes, including signed sports memorabilia, golf packages, and spa experiences, generously donated by local businesses & individuals.

Thanks to the incredible generosity of attendees, the fundraiser raised significant funds for the Kids' Christmas Fund, which provides gifts to children who might otherwise go without.
