


ELKS OF THE MONTH...NELSON GRAHN & JESSICA HOOD



LODGE VETERANS COMMITTEE REPORT

The Tampa Elks 708 Lodge Veterans Committee had a busy month in May. We hosted veterans from two shelters for dinner at the lodge, began a fundraising initiative, and executed an Elks

National Foundation Gratitude Grant to improve the quality of life for the sheltered veterans at Liberty Manor.

We hosted Liberty Manor for dinner on Friday, May 9. They enjoyed Chef Courtney's stuffed pork chops and fellowship with the Tampa Elks 708 members. We took that opportunity for Exalted Ruler T-Michael Boyle to present a \$3500 Elks National Foundation Gratitude Grant check to Liberty Manor's CEO Connie Lindsay, which will be used to pay for the electrician and plumbers required to replace an antiquated tub in a communal bathroom used by four sheltered veterans housed at Liberty Manor for Veterans



with a new ADA-compliant handicap accessible roll-in shower stall. This will allow veterans with mobility issues to safely bathe. Our members helped to remove the old tub at Liberty Manor on May 14 to make way for the new fixtures.

In 1904, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks made a commitment to "lay a solid foundation for the future; building the moral and physical character of American boys and girls, the leaders of tomorrow." Since then, the Elks have done much to fulfill that self-charged responsibility — and not for fanfare or publicity, but simply because they know it is the right thing to do.

The first week in May each year, the Order holds its Elks National Youth Week, recognizing young people for their involvement and achievements in the community. Traditionally, the Elks present awards and plaques to outstanding youngsters during this week, in addition to hosting teams—similar to those that are held all year—that provide young people with ever greater chances to play an active role in their communities.

As part of this Grand Lodge Youth Recognition Program, the Elks offer recognition to Scouting America (formerly Boy Scouts of America) boys and girls who have achieved the Eagle Scout rank. On Sunday, May 25, Tampa Elks 708 Esquire (and Eagle Scout himself) George Hilficker presented certificates and American Flags to four Scouts from Troop 22 who have earned the rank of Eagle Scout at a Court of Honor held at Hyde Park United Methodist Church. DID YOU KNOW?

The Elk colors are Royal Purple and White, deriving its origin from the history of the Clergy, Nobility and the People. Throughout Europe, the Orient and in Rome the symbolism of colors was associated with severity of laws and customs. Each color was identified religious, or political, and to change or alter it was a crime of rebellion, a desertion of principles, party or cause.

White denotes purity and absolute truth. When combined with Royal Purple it signifies the love of truth and the highest degree of virtue. Purple is the badge of Kingship, the color for the royal robes, and signifies highest favor. Blending of White and Royal Purple indicates the favor of the people, which bespeaks the status of Elkdom.
